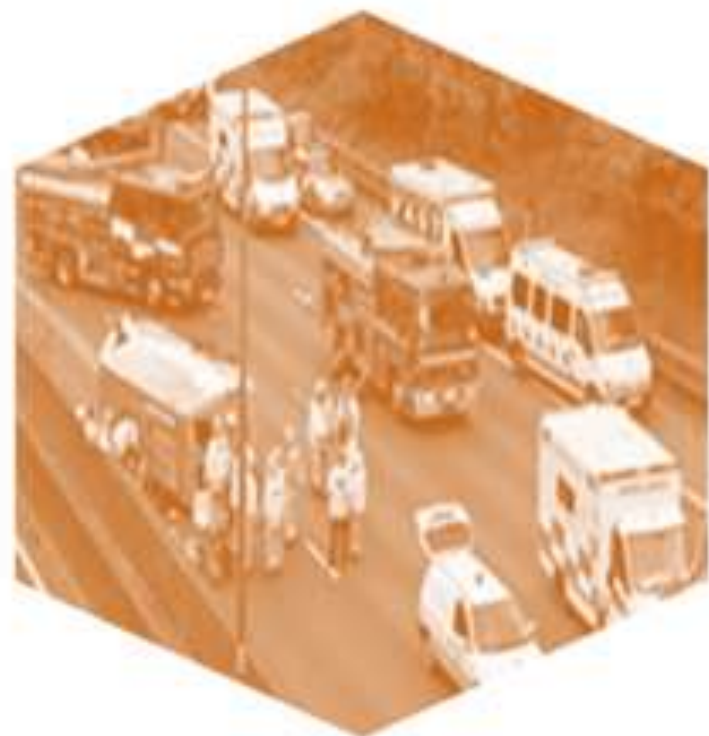

Preparation and planning for emergencies: responsibilities of responder agencies and others	Here	How the government prepares and plans for emergencies, working nationally, locally and co-operatively to ensure civil protection in the UK.
UK infrastructure and resilience	Here	This report examines the resilience of the UK's critical infrastructure, including infrastructure interdependence, barriers and modelling. It focuses on the energy, transport, water and ICT sectors. This review was commissioned as part of the Foresight project on reducing the risk of future disasters.
Resilience in society: infrastructure, communities and businesses	Here	Integrated emergency management (IEM) includes anticipation, assessment, prevention, preparation, response and recovery. Resilience is about all these aspects of emergency management, and this guide deals with the resilience of existing entities the UK such as buildings, systems and networks. The government's aim is to reduce the risk from emergencies so that people can go about their business freely and with confidence. Civil protection practitioners support the work which goes on across the UK to improve emergency preparedness. The wider UK society - public and private sector, communities and businesses - will find it useful to know how their work fits into a wider framework on resilience for their sector.
