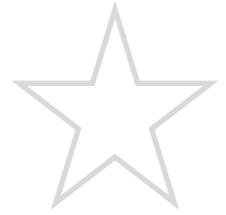

| Cyber-security Information Sharing Partnership (CiSP) | Here | The Cyber-security Information Sharing Partnership (CiSP), part of CERT-UK, is a joint industry government initiative to share cyber threat and vulnerability information in order to increase overall situational awareness of the cyber threat and therefore reduce the impact on UK business. |
| NLAWARP | Here | The NLAWARP serves to encourage the development of multiple, regional Local Authority WARPs and to provide a centralised online services, to reduce the burden on individual WARPs. |

Free at point of access, GSCF also provides a secure environment for Gloucestershire business to engage directly with peers and Gloucestershire Constabulary on incidents or concerns around cybercrime, along with the ability to report it anonymously.
